
THIS GROUP OF CURLY MUSTANGS CARRIES KRT25 AND ALSO AN UNKNOWN CURLY COAT GENE.



EVERY CURLY FROM A NEVADA HMA IS ELIGIBLE FOR PRESERVATION STATUS, THE WILD ONES ARE WHERE MOST OF OUR CURLIES ORIGINATED.
