Of the & horses that I personally broke, and rode were mot very good. There rest both possed and had the ability to put a course a tree. I have been trying to pick my mememory bank for those buts I information i we long forgotter about, but to the best of my ability here goes. Somewhere between 1942 -Newton Brooks, bought a black carly stud colt from a horse trader around Laramie Wyoming Fawcett. The person who would absolutely know was I see foreman of 40 + odd years, a Dean Smith. He now resides my foster mother's ranch which is war owned and operated by my sester in law Patricia Jean (Janus:) This above stude colt leved only 18 years, due mostly to a condition parot mouth where the upper teeth protrude somewhat forward of the lower teeth, making the supping of short grasses impossible. Confirmation wise he had a dished face, with a rather round almost buldging forelead, short ears, very find muses Hes legs were too long for his short back. He was ratter "h with a long length to les hepalot and long fore aims with short common bones. a good deep ches However I fell in love with This house ... The horse was horse boke ouredden. with the wild bunch !

Let me explaint this wild brench. neighbors owned most of the horses about 98 % Louth as Kock Springs of the Brook. and The Laveling Land Ikis range ran from the Green River on the west to The railroad town of Better crock 25 mades to the east. It extended from the V Prailroad on the north to the Colorado Vtah line 40 miles south. sweenigs range was within Ikes range. They both raised their horse on open range . Iwengs had about 1400 lead at one time and Ike had more than that. I'm last time the gathered and sold the each sold over 1200 head, Whey were unable to keep gathered these horses after the cowboys got old and government stopped hunning hossa with airplanes. They didn't know at that time that was the most humane way to handle those welder horses. Those horses that wern't redden regularly were called the wild bunch " Enough of that. You know by now the Blan wound up with most of the horses Back to our story. I broke two sever year old colta Sn. out of this Laranie stud; one girey rater hispool, one black it with a suppor his more. not rater hipped. The grey looked a dead ringer for the old stud except his legs were next so long, and his back was longer. The black horse's head should look at all like the Laramie stud, in fact no part of him ded except the kong foranies and powerful mucles, Doth horses weighed abou 1200, Frosty, the grey was very gentle Snip the black was never gentle . Downer he was without a doubt the strongest borse I ever sat on, Both horses had an exceptional walk and trot. When Inip would stretch into a fast trot his hand foot would pass his front from 32" to 36". Few horses could run as fast as he could trot. Hone assentere could match that

No horse in the wild bushch " including the morgans standard breds, army remount throrobods or tennocsee walkers which had been purchased and turned in to the mares to improve blood lines, none could come close to outruming snip, Trosty was only shortly behind in speed. Dean Smith and I would gather and brand and cull those wild Korses every gear. When we rode those two horses the wild horses would be kept on a constant The out han for distances of 20 miles and more with Dean in front on Snip and me behind on Frosty. Neither one of us would evel break a trot except of one of the marca would by to break Those wild horses, could never match the burst of speed Those cuilies could turn on However, I realize that those two were exception houses and there may never be any more like theore but I had to good ability. Jony was never a con horse hated to turn or seign. this one. He was such a joy to ride. Looked some what like Joys Carly Boy. Even judges in pleasure and reining classes

admired his free and eacy gait.

Then I broke him at 3 yes of age he was very capable of 75 mile day, at materity he could but in a 150 mile day with eace. 4 and 5 of them in a row in fact, I never thed of riding him even though it was hard to hold a saddle when he was fat because of small withers, I could rope any cow on the ranch. It hale they would pitch and bellow in every direction, he would just stand there slilly spreddle legged and look around as if

nothing were happing.

De never had any trouble outruming house or cow, on hillside, soft ground or ice. He have many bradger holes in our country. I hey have attributed to over 75 falls on various horses in my life time, over 25 on frozen meadows. Ive be hung up & times with only on serious injury, but in the 15 years I rode this horse, he fell only once. When he jumped over a bedger hole it caved in on line 3 ft . deep and nort of tick his front legs to the ground. Since we were loping right along it was a short fast trip to the ground, no fault of his. Most of his colle were good ones, but I only had a few mare so his greatest potertial was not realized until I retired him to stud on apen range about 1974. The fathered-all the present day Curlins around Bock Springs, some of which were good looking stock . Some out of the heaver mares from The belgian stud were not so good. I closing I wish to through you for taking the time to faid nee. Once of my littine drawns was to raise a curly breed out of Rocket. That fell by the everycide long age with the passing of my first wife Unno. I am so glad some one besides me has found and enjoyed the last, hase. Around 19 50 to 54 Dice sold about 9 filly colle to a house buyer who took them east toward Hugas and I own. - Meybe some of those showed up in Indiana I also found my Jime Life Book - The Kingdom Of The Hosse, H. H. Isenbart - E. M. Bil Krer. The Bashkir horse is licted there as a Lovest Union horse If Mongolian and Kergling blood, used by the Gral Cossacles. again, Many Thanks to you, feel for to John L. 
